### WV VOAD BRIDGES THE GAP BETWEEN FAMILIES AND THIER HOMES

The West Virginia VOAD Bridge Program received more than 200 requests for bridge repair and reconstruction in the last year (2023), these request join other bridges that are awaiting rebuild and have been completed over the time of West Virginia VOAD's service to the state of West Virginia. Over its' lifetimes West Virginia VOAD has completed a total of 115 bridges which includes a total value of \$4.6 Million of donated dollars, resources, and volunteer time. While the West Virginia VOAD Bridge Program receives many applications, of those hundreds of requests last year, West Virginia VOAD has accepted and acquired funding and donations to rebuild 5 bridges requiring prompt reconstruction in Kanawha, McDowell, Lincoln, Wayne, and


Mingo counties. These bridges are of significant importance and have been prioritized as many of these bridges are the only means for which families with children can access school or individuals with disabilities or chronic ailments can access healthcare. By this spring West Virginia VOAD aims to restore these families' critical access to their homes and return a sense of normalcy to their daily routines by providing them the basic access to their home they deserve.

# WEST VIRGINIA VOAD SUPPORTS THE DISASTER RECOVERY NEEDS OF WEST VIRGINIA FAMILIES

The West Virginia VOAD Case Management Program continues to support the disaster recovery efforts of individuals and families in the great state of West Virginia. A recent example of the WV VOAD Case Management Program's success is the 67.7% approval rate of appeals submitted during Disaster 4605 in Cabell, Kanawha, Mingo, and Wayne counties. West Virginia VOAD's impactful involvement extends beyond monetary assistance, as we also provided essential appliances and other housing items to recovering families. West Virginia VOAD's disaster case managers play a crucial role in assisting families by facilitating connections to essential services, advocating for valid **FEMA appeals**, and developing and implementing recovery plans, fostering a transition to a "new" normal.

## WV VOAD RESPONDS TO DISASTERS ACROSS THE STATE

West Virginia VOAD swiftly responds across the state during disasters and places resources in families' hands following the immediate aftermath of flooding and other disasters that occur in West Virginia. The unfortunate flooding in August of 2023 and the Gas Outages on the West Side of Charelston are just two of the most recent disasters West Virginia VOAD has supported. During the immediate and long-term recovery efforts of these events, West Virginia VOAD worked closely with the West Virginia Emergency Management Division and member organizations to provide families with clean-up kits, muck out/clean-up assistance, and other essential resources and services such as mold abatement, shovels, and other flood clean-up supplies. Through these efforts, West Virginia VOAD was able to support the recovery efforts of West Virginians impacted by the August Floods in Clay, Braxton, Calhoun, Harrison, and Kanawha, which includes more than 90 immediate need cases. West Virginia VOAD also deployed it's Shower and Laundry Trailer for residents of the West Side during the 2023 Gas Outages. Additionally, West Virginia VOAD in the past three years has responded to and assisted in the recovery of Raleigh & Boone counties in January 2023 following an Ice Storm and Putnam, Lincoln, Kanawha, Fayette, Cabell, and Mingo counties in Febuary of 2023; Mercer and McDowell Counties in May of 2023; Mingo & Wetzel in June of 2022; Cabell, Putnam, and Roane counties in May of 2022; McDowell in July of 2022; and Marshall County in June of 2021 for flooding as well as other operations to support West Virginia counties and families such as providing blankets for shelters, bottled water for citizens, and other resources as needed.

### WV VOAD USES FUNDS TO PREPARE WEST VIRGINIA FOR FLOODING

Over the past three years West Virginia VOAD has spent the generous donations and funds it has to better prepare the state of West Virginia and enhance it's capabilities to help families recover and communities respond to disaster.
