



Story Structure Use this narrative writing guide for your story! Learn about exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution.

Climax

This is the turning point! The character faces the conflict. They may go through changes. You might even include their thoughts and feelings.



This is where your conflict develops, and the suspense builds!

Exposition

Build the context for your story. Introduce your characters. What is the setting? Introduce the conflict or problem your character runs into.

Falling Action

This is where you can tie loose ends. The character takes action leading to a solution of the conflict. It's time to conclude the adventure!

Your Story

Resolution

Wrap up your story. The resolution may include a memory, decision, feeling, or wish!




