Mr. Speaker,

It is with a profound sense of gratitude and pride that I write to you today. Across the 83rd, 84th, 85th, 86th, and 87th West Virginia Legislatures, we have made history. It has been an incredible privilege to serve the people of the 16th and later the 22nd Delegate Districts. The people of Cabell and Lincoln counties are terrific, and it has been my highest honor to serve them. That service was made all the better serving with our truly distinguished colleagues over these years.

I ran for office to deliver results for West Virginia and my district. I believe we've done that. We've stopped measuring investment in our state in millions and now do so in billions. We allocated more resources for our infrastructure – roads, bridges, water, wastewater, and broadband internet – than at any other point in our state's history.
